#### Framework



# México - Important Facts



01	FSC Certification	<ul> <li>Only 3 communities are FSC certified.</li> <li>Non of all the communities see benefits for being FSC.</li> <li>Some of them are thinking on maintaining or getting FSC certification because a carbon of credit project.</li> </ul>
02	Land - holding	<ul> <li>The communities own the land.</li> <li>Part of the area is communal and part of it is splitted between each family who decides what to do with it.</li> </ul>
03	Forest management	<ul> <li>Strong knowledge and commitment about sustainable forest management.</li> <li>Forest plan between 40% and 60% of the area.</li> <li>They harvest between 10% and 20% of the approved vol.</li> </ul>
04	Processing facilities	<ul> <li>Only 2 ejidos have facilities to process their timber.</li> <li>1 community is going to receive a woodmizer in 2 weeks.</li> <li>The rest of them sell in logs.</li> </ul>
05	Market	<ul> <li>Logs are being sold locally in a range of U\$100.</li> <li>They have strong local market for Caoba, Cedar and Chicozapote.</li> <li>They harvest according to the order they receive.</li> </ul>
06	Export experience	<ul> <li>Some of them have done international sells, however last experience was so bad, that all communities are afraid to export. Noh Bec did not receive remaining U\$25,000.</li> </ul>


#### México - Caobas Visit











- They have tried to produce bees boxes, however their price were to high compare to the local market ( are made from pine).
- They have tried to produce some other products such as kitchen tools, napkin rings, panels, tables etc. however they have been having quality issue because the timber is not kilnd dry.
- Now is no longer working, but in some moment they have employed around 25 woman, and they are looking now how to re activate it.

# Guatemala - Important Facts



01	FSC Certification	<ul> <li>All the communities are FSC certified.</li> <li>All of them are certified because it is mandatory by the government.</li> </ul>
02	Land - holding	<ul> <li>Communities do not own the land.</li> <li>They have a 25 years concession agreement.</li> <li>Between last year and this, the first 25 years has ended, so they are in the process to renewed it.</li> </ul>
03	Forest management	<ul> <li>Strong knowledge and commitment about sustainable forest management.</li> <li>Forest plan between 40% and 60% of the area.</li> </ul>
04	Processing facilities	<ul> <li>Almost all communities has its own sawmill.</li> <li>They have create a community company called FORESCOM to produce more end products. However most of the communities prefer to deal direct.</li> </ul>
05	Market	<ul> <li>They are selling caoba for music industry and decking from pucte and machinche to Spain.</li> <li>Chicozapote is well sold in local market for construction.</li> <li>Expecting price for LKTS U\$775/m3 FCA.</li> </ul>
06	Export experience	<ul> <li>They have been exporting since many years ago to Spain, US and Dominican Republic mainly.</li> <li>Although they have export experience they prefer to sell FCA.</li> </ul>

# Honduras - Important Facts




01	FSC Certification	<ul> <li>The 16 communities (Cooperativa how are they called in Honduras) had until last year 2 group FSC Certification.</li> <li>The status now is certification suspended.</li> </ul>
02	Land - holding	<ul> <li>The Cooperativas own the land.</li> <li>One of the biggest issue they have is land invasion from other people that comes in to deforestate and use the land for other activities.</li> </ul>
03	Forest management	<ul> <li>The big challenge they have is that the forest is located in mountains.</li> <li>For easier transport, they cut the logs into blocks in the forest with a chainsaw.</li> </ul>
04	Processing facilities	<ul> <li>They have 2 communities company: COATLHAL (still working) and CORAMEL(stopped operations 2021).</li> <li>COATLHAL sell 25% sawn timber and 75% furniture.</li> <li>They can do KD.</li> </ul>
05	Market	<ul> <li>Local market for sawn timber and furniture.</li> <li>They sell 2 CT Furniture per year to Denmark.</li> </ul>
06	Export experience	<ul> <li>They have experience exporting, however this year they haven't export yet.</li> <li>Positive is that they have a good port just 220km from their sawmill.</li> </ul>


